


## Uploading Course Syllabi in Populi

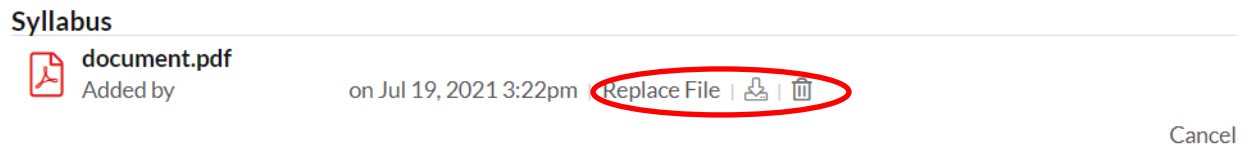
### Replacing or updating a syllabus:
